- Third category: murals for students aged 13 to 18 (secondary education). In connection with sustainable development goals and especially with SDG number 16, participants are invited to draw their ideas to achieve a peaceful and inclusive society.

 Four category: school celebration. It consists of a drawing and pictures of a school celebration dedicated to the Rights of Children.
